The Market Cross is now in desperate need of repair and renovation to prevent any further deterioration. Estimates for this specialist work are in the region of £20k to date. Your Parish Council has been able to raise half of this amount using the £400 prize from Best Kept Village, a donation from the Solar Farm development at Foston and Easyfundraising. In addition, we have been trying for some years to obtain a grant for this work from various government and charitable organisations without success, although our efforts are continuing. However, we do have to raise the funds required as a matter of urgency, so we are launching an appeal for help as we would ideally like to be able to commission a contractor to begin the necessary repair and restoration work sometime this year. We value the Cross and its long history and would appreciate any help and ideas for raising the funds required. If you feel able to make a donation (however small) to this project it would be welcomed and cheques payable to 'Allington Lincolnshire Amenity Fund' can be sent to the Allington Parish Council Clerk, 72 Park Road.

Covid Vaccinations

GP surgeries in the Grantham and Sleaford area have been working together to deliver the Covid-19 vaccination campaign since mid-December 2020. This has been hugely successful up to now, with just short of 40,000 vaccinations administered at the main vaccination centre at The Meres Leisure Centre in Grantham, in nursing and residential care homes, and to our housebound patients. We are working through the cohorts and at the time of writing are inviting the 60 -64 age cohort.

We ask that patients who are still to have their vaccination remain patient as we will get to you very shortly. If you have decided that you do not wish to have the vaccine then please let a member of our Reception team know and we will record your wishes and remove you from the invitation system.

We understand that things change very quickly and really do appreciate it if those patients who have access to our Facebook page and website can pass on any information to friends and neighbours who may not have access to social media – thank you for helping to spread the word!

Blood Pressure

Despite there being a pandemic we still need you to keep an eye on your blood pressure, especially if you have a pre-existing condition which requires you to provide us with regular readings. A number of patients have asked us about buying their own blood pressure monitor as well as asking for advice on how to take their blood pressure at home. The British and Irish Blood Pressure Society have a website with a really useful section on BP monitors and publish the only independent, peer-reviewed list of blood pressure monitors that is not governed by commercial interest. If you decide to purchase a home blood pressure monitor there are some top tips for taking your BP effectively.

Measure your blood pressure twice daily. The first measurement should be in the morning before eating or taking any

Measure your blood pressure twice daily. The first measurement should be in the morning before eating or taking any medications, and the second in the evening. Each time you measure, take two or three readings to make sure your results are accurate

Don't measure your blood pressure right after you wake up. You can prepare for the day, but don't eat breakfast or take medications before measuring your blood pressure. If you exercise after waking, take your blood pressure before exercising.

Avoid food, caffeine, tobacco and alcohol for 30 minutes before taking a measurement. These can all raise your blood pressure temporarily.

Go to the toilet before taking a measurement. A full bladder can increase blood pressure slightly.

Make sure your arm is positioned properly. Always use the same arm when taking your blood pressure. Rest your

arm, raised to the level of your heart, on a table, desk or chair arm. You might need to place a pillow or cushion under your arm to elevate it high enough.

Place the cuff on bare skin, not over clothing. Rolling up a sleeve until it tightens around your arm can result in an inaccurate reading, so you may need to slip your arm out of the sleeve.

Keep still and quiet while you take your reading. Moving, chewing, talking and laughing can affect your reading. Make sure you don't cross your legs, as this will raise your reading too.

Take a repeat reading. Wait for one to three minutes after the first reading, and then take another to check accuracy. If your monitor doesn't automatically log blood pressure readings or heart rates, write them down.

Village Produce Show

Back in the mist of time the prospect of organising a village produce show was being discussed by members of the Allington WI. Three members were given the task of researching the proposal. They were Jean Potter, Mrs Joan Bennett and Pam Jackson.

The first show was held in September 1975.

The number of entries outshone anything the organisers could have imagined, and certainly made the work that went into the staging of the produce show worthwhile. It was a lot of work setting up the village hall, but we all had fun and laughter whilst sorting it out especially for the first show.





The village hall at that time had a number of trestle tables, in varying sizes, the longest being housed in a barn at George Doubleday's home just across the road. To enable the entries to be displayed at their best, we were able to stand the wooden chairs from the hall on the tables, covering the chairs and trestles with hessian borrowed from the WI county federation, which gave a tiered setting.

The Produce Show caused friendly rivalry amongst the vegetable growers of the village especially the growing of the largest onion. The third Produce Show in 1979 saw entries top 300. The show prospered over the years with trophies for each section being donated by residents of the village who so enjoyed taking part. An award board naming the winner of the most points scored in the show was displayed in the alcove at the village hall. This Honour board must still be in existence somewhere?

Sadly, over time the entries began to dwindle which led to the last show being held in 1990.

OBITUARY

Dr Carol Tung Tung Fan Black

From being tested positive on the 25th January 2021, Dr Carol Black died on Thursday February 4th from COVID19 (Carol had no known underlying health issues). It was Carol's 60th Birthday.

Carol and Dr Andrew Black were married at Allington Church. Carol was a devoted wife, daughter, sister,

mother, stepmother and grandmother. She always wanted to talk about others never about her own life. Her wonderful sense of humour would often mask her serious achievements. Carol was

awarded a Degree at Cambridge and went on to achieve a Master's Degree and a PhD at Nottingham University.

With many visits to China and all over the UK & Europe, Carol organised deputations to Beijing and Shanghai with Peter Wheeler CEO Leicester Tigers, Martin Johnson (Ex England & Lions Captain), Rory Underwood, Lord Digby Jones of Birmingham and David Hands Rugby Correspondent for the Daily Telegraph. In Beijing, Carol was presented to the Chinese Sports Minister in the Olympic Hall, a great honour in her culture. Carol arranged flights, sponsorship, television interviews, coaching clinics, charity dinners and a game of rugby union in Shanghai between the Chinese Army and a local English Patriots Group. Another match was arranged between a Chinese Sevens and Leicester Tigers on their way to Italy. Carol was made an Honorary Corporal in the Chinese Army in recognition of her work. Carol's next project was to write a book on Chinese history and politics. At the last count it was over a 1000 pages - 4/5 years work. Carol as a child was brought up during the Cultural Revolution in China and it left many unhappy experiences and memories. Carol felt very safe in Allington, she loved it and the people.

Dr Black hopes to arrange a celebration of Carol's amazing life one Sunday afternoon at Allington Church, with a reception at the Manor. It will be an Open House and, once the date is known, all will be invited ...



lan was keen to offer something different and, with support from Karen, formulated a complete Sixties experience consisting of a Sixties Band, Disco and a video presentation showing memories of the era in the form of films, fashion and news clips.

As with all new bands, it took quite an effort to get the band established in the area but now, they have a loyal local fan base, many of whom live in Allington, who cannot wait for the current Covid restrictions to be lifted to hear them again.

The band plays locally at Great Gonerby Social Club three times a year and has also appeared at Allington Village Hall, which saw villagers getting taken back in time with videos, music and raising nearly £500 for local charities, including the Village Cross, Holy Trinity Church and the Heart Foundation.

The bands reputation is now spreading, and they have played in Theatres, Social clubs, and at private functions throughout the East Midlands and even at two

National Waterways Festivals – such is the sixties appeal.

Please note that the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council Meeting dates have now changed. The Annual Parish Meeting is on the 29 April and the Annual Parish Council Meeting is on the 6 May 2021.

Planning Application No: S20/1870 - Tanglewood, 29 Allington Road – erection of annexe to rear of dwelling – South Kesteven District Council granted the planning permission,

Planning Appeal - Land at Allington Road - the Parish Council have sent comments on the Planning Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate and a decision should be received within

Planning Request for extension to Sedgebrook cemetery the Clerk to discuss the planning application with the Duty Officer of SKDC Planning.

Planning Application No: S21/0280 Chestnut Farm, Village Street - replacement of roof tiles and underlay - repair of structural timbers, repair of dormers, addition of roof lights - the Parish Council had no objections to the proposed Listed Building Consent Application.

Street Sign for Allington Road – Clarification has been requested from SKDC on the boundaries of the road from the A52 out to the Allington border of Village Street. There is some confusion as to the naming of Allington Road and Village Street which do not marry up with the Ordnance Survey Map and the addresses which have been given to various properties.

Allington Road Railway Bridge Flooding – County Councillor Mark Whittington had taken up the matter with LCC Highways. Flooding had occurred due to surplus water on the railway embankment which is the property of Network Rail who have always denied responsibility. However, Network Rail have now admitted liability. Lincolnshire County Council will be completing the work required (as Network Rail are unable to schedule in the repair work but Network Rail will pay LCC). The work originally scheduled for 22 March to the 29 March has now been rescheduled for later in the year.

Flooding investigations – The Parish Council continue to work with the County Council as the Local Lead Flood Authority on the various flooding issues within the village. The County Council are carrying out various investigations related to recent flood events and will be formally reporting these once complete. It was noted that the maintenance liabilities of some ditches in the Parish was a matter that Riparian owners might he unaware of. The County Council would discuss the maintenance obligations where necessary to ensure that ditches drained effectively. The Parish Council have been offered sand and sandbags and the Parish Council are looking at storage solutions so that the sand/bags are more accessible to the

Tree Management – an inspection of the trees in the Recreation Field and the tree on the Village Green will be completed shortly

Footpaths - The Senior Countryside Officer is investigating some issues relating to the historic standing of the footpath which leads from School Lane towards the A52.

A new finger post is due to be installed shortly on the Viking Way footpath close to the railway crossing on Sewstern Lane. Viking Way – the County Council are aware of the right of way which is being destroyed by 4x4s. There are large ruts which are full of water making it impassable by foot and bicycle.
